The Need for Older Toddler Classrooms

Older Toddler classrooms should employ learning stations that support a wide variety of activities for children. Play stations let children envision themselves in a variety of real-life and imaginary scenarios. Stations that emphasize fine motor skills help children foster independence as they learn to use writing tools or work with buttons, zippers, snaps and laces. Reading stations let children work on the foundations of language and vocabulary. Storage and furnishings need to be low enough to allow teachers to observe all children, wherever they are in the room.

Requirements for a Great Older Toddler Classroom

For **students**, an ideal toddler classroom should help them advance through developmental milestones and begin preparing them for kindergarten. Stations should be positioned within close proximity, so students can easily move from one learning area to another. Furnishings should be appropriately sized for early-learners, so they stay comfortable throughout the day.

For **teachers**, the toddler classroom should feature furnishings with a low profile, to ensure all children can be seen at all times, no matter where they are in the room. Teachers should be able to easily move between stations as they observe children or oversee lessons and activities. Shelving, carts and locking storage units keep classroom materials organized and out of reach.

For **administrators**, the best toddler classroom features intelligently-selected furnishing that meet the requirements of their space. All products should be available at the time they are needed, and orders must arrive correctly and on time. Installations must be quick and efficient.

The **sensory station** allows children to experiment with hands-on projects or engage in sensory play. The **sensory table** allows children to play with sand, water or manipulatives and an **exploration table** is perfect for early learning science projects or group activities.

The **changing station** ensures caregivers can offer little ones a safe and comfortable place for changing. **Changing**

tables keep children secure during changes. A vinyl pad on the table keeps little ones comfortable, and **diaper storage** keeps changing supplies close at hand.

A **resting station** with **cots** gives toddlers a cozy place to nap. The cots feature a one-piece construction making them easy to stack and clean, and heat-sealed seams that prevent fraying.

The **Storage Area** keeps your young toddler classroom organized. Low profile storage units ensure caregivers can see all areas of the room at all times. This area includes:

- **Lockers**
- **Teacher's cabinet**
- **Classroom storage**

Lockers store infants' coats, hats and other outdoor wear so caregivers can quickly get little ones ready for outdoor playtime or to go home for the day.
